lished collection of Shakespeare’s plays, will open Friday at the **Folger Shakespeare Library** and continue through Sept. 3.

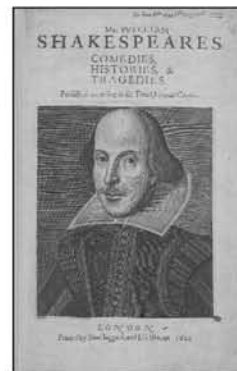
Located at 201 East Capitol St. SE, the library is open Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. 202-544-7077.
